About StudentAid BC

StudentAid BC supports over 80,000 university and college students each year with **grants, loans & other financial assistance programs.**

About StudentAid BC

Grants = Money you do not have to pay back.

Loans =

- Money you will have to repay
- Payment-free while you are in school full-time
- Provincial and federal loans are interest-free

Other financial assistance = specific supports for:

- Low- and middle-income students
- Students who have a permanent disability, or a persistent or prolonged disability
- Current and former children or youth in care
- Borrowers who need help with repayment

How to apply

2 Steps to Apply:

Step 1

- Set up the BC Services Card account. A one-time security check verifies your identity with your BC Services Card or other [accepted ID](#).

Step 2

- Log in to StudentAid BC with the BC Services Card account and apply online.

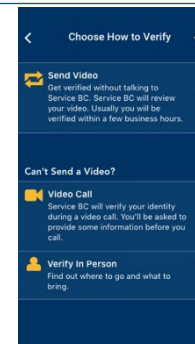
How to apply

Set up the BC Services Card account 1-2-3...

1. Get the BC Services Card app from the App Store or Google Play



2. Verify your identity. This makes sure no one else can set up the app with your ID.

A student who is enrolled in at least 20 to 59 percent of a full course load at a designated public or private post-secondary institution.

Application timeline



Set up the BC Services Card account, and verify your identity

Log in with the BC Services Card account

Apply before study or up to 6 weeks before it ends

Receive Notice of Assessment

Sign Loan Agreement

Receive Loans and Grants

How much funding you can receive

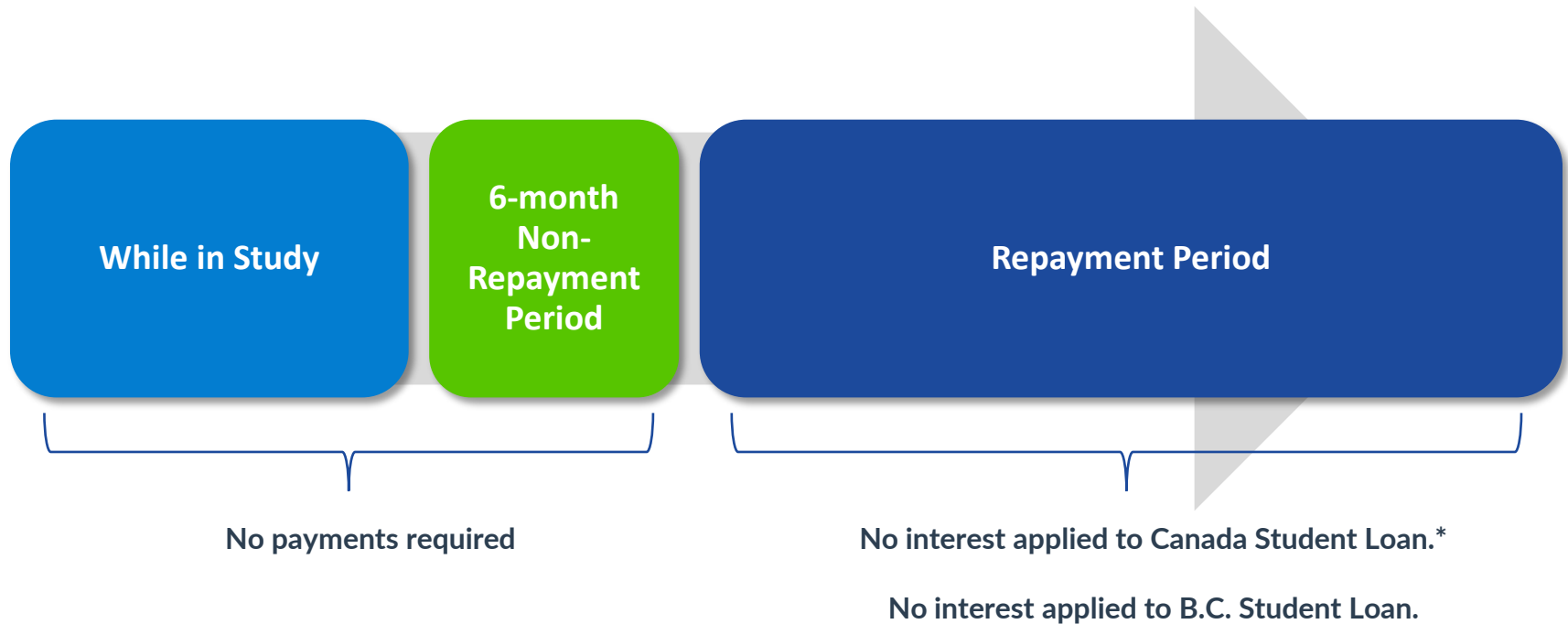
StudentAid BC determines how much funding you can receive by comparing your education and living costs (tuition, books, rent, etc.) and your available financial resources (individual and family income, savings, scholarships, etc.).

The amount of funding you receive depends on your individual and family financial situation.

StudentAid BC funding may not cover the full cost of your education or training.

*As of April 1, 2023, the accrual of interest on Canada Student Loans has been permanently eliminated. Borrowers continue to be responsible to pay any interest that may have accrued prior to April 1, 2023.
