

# Resource Directory of Accessibility Programs and Services for Students with Disabilities in Public Post-Secondary Institutions

---

## Introduction

The Province of British Columbia has declared its commitment to access to education for all students with disabilities. Through the development of policy, procedures and the implementation of programs, the Province has addressed student needs at public post-secondary education institutions through the development of programs making up the Accessibility Supports Framework.

Programs and services for students with disabilities have grown and improved over the past decades. The objective of the Ministry of Advanced Education and Skills Training (AEST) is to ensure that students with disabilities are appropriately represented in the post-secondary population, receive barrier free access to education and acquire the skills and training necessary to transition to the labour market.

Beginning in Program Year 2022/23 eligibility for programs under the Accessibility Supports Framework will include students with a verified Permanent Disability and students with a verified Persistent or Prolonged Disability.

Permanent Disability is defined as:

any impairment, including a physical, mental, intellectual, cognitive, learning, communication or sensory impairment - or a functional limitation - that restricts the ability of a person to perform the daily activities necessary to pursue studies at a post-secondary school level or to participate in the labour force and that is expected to remain with the person for the person's expected life.

Persistent or Prolonged Disability is defined as:

any impairment, including a physical, mental, intellectual, cognitive, learning, communication or sensory impairment - or a functional limitation - that restricts the ability of a person to perform the daily activities necessary to pursue studies at a post-secondary school level or to participate in the labour force and has lasted, or is expected to last, for a period of at least 12 months but is not expected to remain with the person for the person's expected life.

The Resource Directory of Accessibility Programs and Services has been developed in consultation with the Accessibility Services Articulation Committee and is updated on an annual basis. The document is intended to provide information on programs available through the Accessibility Supports Framework and Accessibility Support Service contacts for potential students, their counselors, families, and referral agencies.

The Directory is organized alphabetically by institution, with separate listings of services and programs.

# Accessibility Support Services for Students with Disabilities Public Post-Secondary Institutions

---

The Accessibility Services or Resource Centre is the contact area at post-secondary institutions for students identifying as having a disability and seeking to access Accessibility Support Services. The Accessibility office provides accessible learning, environmental services and supports to students with disabilities through liaison with faculty and other campus offices in a manner that is supportive of the students' educational needs.

The office also collaborates with AEST and external service providers as needed to support students with disabilities. All services and accommodations are assigned based on assessment information provided by medical assessors and the student outlining the nature and extent of their disability and the functional impact(s) it may have in an educational environment. Students are advised to access Accessibility Support Services at their respective institution Accessibility Centre two to four months before starting classes to allow for accommodation planning and preparation.

The following is a general process for the provision of services and supports. More detailed information can be obtained by contacting the Accessibility Office at each institution.

## Introductory Meeting

### Purpose/Outcomes

- To acquire information relevant to assessing educational access needs
- Opportunity for the student and accessibility services staff to build a relationship
- Accessibility Services staff can discuss procedures with students
- Opportunity for the student to articulate their needs
- Discuss accessibility as it relates to educational and physical access
- Discuss and acquire documentation (Colleges and Universities have documentation requirement guidelines)
- Review historical information
- Begin problem solving and planning for supports and services
- Make referrals as needed
- Assistance in the acquisition of financial assistance

- Acquire written consents as needed
- Determine appropriate accommodations: decisions are based on documentation, student reported need, historical information, essential requirements of the course or program, and Institutional Accommodation Policy
- The appropriate level of accommodation is provided to ensure any barriers to education are reduced as much as possible.

## Environmental Accommodations

### Physical

- On campus technological supports

## Funding Options

---

Financial assistance and assistive equipment/services programs have been established to support students requiring accessibility-related accommodations. This section summarizes these programs. These programs are available to students who have verified their disability as either a Permanent, or a Persistent or Prolonged Disability with StudentAid BC. ### Assistance Program for Student with Disabilities (APSD)

**Amount:** Up to \$10,000 per annum (\$12,000 if attendant care services required)

**Eligibility:** Verified disability and demonstrated financial need

**Application:** Appendix 8 (Disability Programs Application Form) for post-secondary programs and the APSD Application Form for non post-secondary programs.

**Special Documentation Requirements:** Medical Documentation (if non post-secondary)

**Accessibility Coordinator Involvement:** Administers APSD program

### BC Access Grant for Students with a Disability (BCAG)

**Amount:** Will replace up to \$1,560 per annum of BC Student Loan funding with this non-repayable grant.

**Eligibility:** Verified disability and demonstrated financial need through application for a student loan.

**Application:** Appendix 8 Form (one time)

### BC Access Grant for Deaf Students (BCAG-DS)

**Amount:** Up to \$30,000 per annum

**Eligibility:** Verified hearing disability, student loan eligible and attending Gallaudet University or Rochester Technical Institute.

**Application:** Appendix 8 Form (one time)



### BC Supplementary Bursary for Students with Disabilities (SBSD)

**Amount:** Up to \$400 per annum for Part-Time Students

Up to \$800 per annum for Full-Time Students

**Eligibility:** Verified disability and demonstrated financial need through application for a student loan

**Application:** Appendix 8 Form (one time)

### Canada Student Grant for Persons with Disabilities (CSG-PD)

**Amount:** \$2,000 per annum

**Eligibility:** Verified disability and demonstrated financial need through application for a student loan.

**Application:** Appendix 8 Form (one time)

### Canada Student Grant for Services and Equipment for Persons with Disabilities (CSG-DSE)

**Amount:** Up to \$20,000 per annum

**Eligibility:** Verified disability and demonstrated financial need through application for a student loan.

**Application:** Appendix 8 Form

**Accessibility Coordinator Involvement:** Requires signature and completion of applicable section of Appendix 8. Accessibility Coordinators encouraged to be involved in the Technology Assessment Plan process with Assistive Technology British Columbia (ATBC)

### Psycho-Educational (Learning Disability) Assessment Reimbursement (part of CSG-DSE)

**Amount:** Maximum of 100% up to \$3,500

**Eligibility:** Verified disability

**Application:** Appendix 8 Form

**Special Documentation Requirements:** Attachment of Psycho-ed Assessment and findings

**Accessibility Coordinator Involvement:** Explaining program. May need to provide a letter explaining services received by the student.

### Learning Disability Assessment Bursary (LDAB)

**Amount:** Up to \$1,800 towards purchase of a psycho-educational assessment

**Eligibility:** Student Loan eligible, in post-secondary program and recommended by Accessibility Coordinator

**Application:** Learning Disability Assessment Bursary Application Form

**Accessibility Coordinator Involvement:** Administers the program and screens applicants

Academic Communication Equity (ACE) is funded by AEST and housed at the British Columbia Institute of Technology (BCIT). The program's mandate is to promote public post-secondary education that is accessible for students who are deaf, hard of hearing or deaf-blind and attending or planning to attend college or university in British Columbia (BC).

Supports are provided to accessibility coordinators, administrators, staff, and service providers working in post-secondary institutions across BC. The program also offers resources for students who want to explore service options in post-secondary. ACE offers:

ATBC recognizes that disability reflects diverse characteristics and experiences integral to society. To that end, ATBC collaborates with persons with disabilities and members of the learning and working environments in which they interact, to create usable, equitable, inclusive and sustainable environments through the use of assistive technology.

### Technology resources include:

- Technology assessment,
- Consultation
- Provision of assistive technology
- Training and tip sheets on the use of assistive technology
- Repair and trouble-shooting support, and evaluation of new technologies.

### Technology Programs Managed by ATBC includes:

#### ➤ **Canada Student Grant for Services and Equipment for Persons with Disabilities (CSG-DSE)**

This grant is designed to help students overcome educational barriers resulting from a disability. Eligible students may apply to receive a non-repayable Grant (for up to \$20,000 per program year) for assistive technology to help access public or private post-secondary institutions. Referral source: Public post-secondary accessibility coordinator or advisor.

#### ➤ **Program for Institutional Loans of Adaptive Technology (PILAT)**

The PILAT program is designed to support public post-secondary institutions in meeting their

duty to accommodate students with disabilities through the provision of supplementary assistive technology resources. The program supplements existing institutional resources as extraordinary issues arise through the provision of assistive technology support, training on the use of assistive technology to institutional staff, and bulk pricing for institutional purchases.

➤ **Public Post-Secondary Loan Service (PPL)**

The PPL program is designed to provide for the loan of assistive technology to students with disabilities in post-secondary who are not able to access other existing support programs (CSG-DSE or APSD).
